## Good News Feedback of the year:

### **Community Involvement**

#### **Helping a father in Need**

Ally, a Zimbabwean father of three, was struggling to provide for his children after losing employment. When Community Representative Gloria Hungana heard his story, she acted immediately. Thanks to the generosity of the Helderberg community, Halli Trust supported Ally with groceries, household items, furniture, clothing, and more until April 2024. His journey continues to be challenging, but with the help of his brother's wife, he is managing to care for his children.

#### **Timely Relief After the Storm**

After a devastating storm in April 2024, a Nomzamo resident, relying solely on her SASSA pension, had to use her entire grant to repair her shack, leaving her without food. When Halli Trust arrived with a grocery parcel, she broke down in tears, overwhelmed by the perfect timing of this *Unexpected Gift and Blessing*.

#### **The Basket Girls Initiative**

Inspired by Ally's story, two young sisters created "The Basket Girls" initiative in April 2024. They invited community members to donate goods, which they then delivered to Halli Trust. Their kind hearts and proactive spirit made a remarkable impact.

#### **Groceries for Families in Need**

In June 2024, Community Representative Anastacia Molaoa delivered groceries to two families in Nomzamo, Lwandle, and Zola. When she visited them again, the families were moved to tears, expressing gratitude as their cupboards had been empty.

#### **A Miracle for a Family in Macassar**

A family in Macassar was desperate and praying for help. Community Representative Jolyn Joseph, together with Matthew Joseph, responded. The children collected the groceries, and when the mother woke to find them, she ran outside in tears, praising God for answering her prayers.

#### **Purpose through Knitting**

After joining Halli Trust in April 2024, Jolyn Joseph found deeper meaning in her love for knitting. She began creating beanies for those in need in her community, turning a hobby into a purpose.

#### **Winter Warmth with Somp & Beans**

In July 2024, OK Foods donated 70 bags containing packets of somp, beans, and split peas. These were distributed to families during the harsh winter, helping them prepare warm, nutritious meals.

#### **Shack Repairs and Shelter for Fire Victims**

Thanks to generous donations from Mytha, Timo, Vaslo, Johan, and Roberto from Switzerland, we repaired a young man's shack and built two more for fire victims, complete with cement flooring. We also repaired a roof and installed electricity for another affected household.

#### **Honouring a Founding Vision**

Community Representative Gloria Hungana, who co-founded Halli Trust with Heidi Naude in 2010, reflected on the 14 years of growth. From emergency support to helping families earn an income, Gloria emphasized the lasting difference made possible through Halli Friends.

#### **Christmas Blessings**

In December 2024, 33 families received essential groceries, toiletries, and cleaning supplies. Their gratitude was heartfelt, as these gifts arrived just when they needed them most.

#### **Back-to-School Joy**

In January 2025, Halli Trust provided 28 children with new school clothes, shoes, and stationery. Many were receiving these items for the first time. Their joy and pride were truly heartwarming.

#### **A Timely Parcel, A Life-Saving Gift**

One family contacted Anastacia Molaoa in December 2024, overwhelmed with gratitude. After paying medical bills for the wife's heart condition, they had just R600 left. The grocery parcel they received allowed them to buy her medication, a true miracle.

### **New Shoes, New Confidence**

In February 2025, we provided school shoes and uniforms to two children from the Qashani family. One of the boys had been wearing gumboots to school. His face lit up with joy as he stepped into his brand-new shoes.

### **From Despair to a Bachelors Pass**

In September 2024, Gloria Hungana assisted a family in which a daughter, facing severe hardship, considered dropping out of school. With Halli Trust's support, she not only returned but excelled, earning a Bachelors pass in Matric.

### **A Vision Realized: Sponsoring a Child**

At our 2024 Strategic Meeting, Gloria shared a dream of supporting children's education. Though funds were initially unavailable, visiting donors Johann Kapp and Roberta Oats from Switzerland, unaware of our plans, expressed their wish to sponsor a child. This incredible alignment gave birth to our "*Sponsoring a Child*" initiative.

We are proud to announce that **Luvuyo Makandula** was selected as our first sponsored student. From Grade 7 through Grade 12, all her school needs will be covered, turning a dream into reality.

### **Growing Halli Clubs**

Our Halli Clubs in Nomzamo and Smartie Town have grown remarkably! An 8-month programme launched with excitement and engagement. Learning and Reading Clubs also showed strong development and impact.

### **Sporting Spirit**

On 6 July 2024, Smartie Town Halli Club children formed a tunnel to welcome the Helderberg Rugby Club's first team onto the field. Their presence helped energize the team, who won the match that day!

### **The Impact of SACAP Students**

Three SACAP students in 2024 offered invaluable counselling support. Their dedication went beyond academics, forming strong bonds with the children. As Zuleika Van Niekerk said:

"This was not just a studying priority; it was a personal journey."

### **Needlework Empowerment**

Mentors Lynn Merry and Anna Mntwana guided three women through a needlework programme. The women gained professional sewing skills, earned sewing machine certificates, and began dreaming of starting their own businesses.

### **Rehabilitation and Caring of Animals**

#### **Kennels, Sterilisation & Food**

In April 2024, in honour of Frau Myrtha Loeffel, we purchased 22 kennels through the Purple Kennel Project, sterilised 10 animals, and distributed food and Nexgard for dogs, puppies, and cats.

### **Feeding More Furry Friends**

Thanks to our Halli Team's initiative, we are now feeding even more animals across various communities, ensuring they too receive love and care.

A chance conversation in December 2023 led Elvira from The Store to connect Halli Trust with her partner Shane, an employee at In2Foods. The company now donates juice regularly, benefiting schools, NPOs, and more.
