Volunteers:

33 children and adults volunteered at Halli Trust during the year

Maintenance:

The Toyota Corolla, which Marvin is driving, received branding and a lot of maintenance and panel beating was done. We replaced the brakes, the radiator, engine gasket, 1 side window, tyres and car seats. Some body repair work was done. Still need to attend to the silencer and the gearbox of the car.

Team News:

Heidi did research regarding the team structure and got help from few people - Inyathelo, Dr Garth Japhet and Dirk Koeglenberg from Exceed. A guide for the Halli Trust Representatives and Corporate Governance Guide for Halli Trust Trustees were drawn up.





Trustees and representatives will serve for a period of 3 years, where after they will resign with the option of re-applying, to serve for another 3 years.

Heidi will fill the position as CEO of Halli Trust.

New Halli Ways were implemented to establish a standard to the team, especially of what is excepted of each volunteer.

The current team all resigned at the end of the financial year.

Highlights of the year:

The building of the United Methodist Church of Southern Africa in Asanda Village is our biggest project so far. Martin has done a huge thing for the church and for Halli Trust as we will benefit with this building to use it for our Halli Clubs and for training in the community.

The Home work classes in Smartie Town made a huge difference. The children's marks improved from 3's and 4's to 6's and 7's during the year. Big thank you to Annissa and Richard for their diligence and dedication with the weekly classes.

We started Homework classes for both Halli Clubs and Kidz Yoga was given to Halli Club children for one term.

Veronica (14 years), from Smartie Town went to out-patient rehab at Help Me Network. Olie Basson, our Substance Abuse Representative, assisted and encouraged her, and she is now clean and back at school.

Elsie Jack, our Community Representative, assisted the De Beer Family in Smartie Town for a long time, encouraging them to stop using substance and in October 2017 they made a renewed commitment to the Lord Jesus and the whole family stopped with using substance. Sometimes it's the little things we do that make big changes.

The few building materials that we bought for Nelson in Wag 'n Bietjie, Asanda Village, helped him to build a small house. He is so proud of his house. His words: "Mommy, I am so proud of my house, every morning when I wake up and I look around I say to myself this is all mine".

A very big highlight is the Halli Club and Halli Leaders Club we started this year. We have about 100 children in each club, Smartie Town and Nomzamo. We made the 11-year old children Halli Leaders and we are very proud of them. We can already see the change in the children and we are super excited what the future has in store for them.

Ronechia from Smartie Town will be going to Rusthof School in January 2019. It was a long process to get her in, but with the help of a lot of people, her mom and Helen, she is going, and this will make a huge difference in her life.

ACVV Strand contacted Halli Trust in September 2015 about Samantha, to ask if we could help a young lady. She was in foster care and we helped her with stationery, toiletries, school clothes and clothing. 2 Years later Gloria, our Nomzamo Community Representative, bumped into Samantha and was asked if she could remember her? Gloria answered no, then Samantha told her about a visit that was made by Gloria and the white lady (Heidi) years ago. Halli Trust gave her a calculator and she managed to finish school. She is now studying Law at UWC. Gloria was so excited with joy in her heart to see what impact she had in this student's life. We want to thank Gloria Hungana for the difference she made in Samantha's life. Samantha said she will never forget Halli Trust!!!

I would like to thank the Halli Trust team for their hard work. This is one amazing team. I am privileged to work with such awesome people. I want to thank you for your dedication and loyalty.
