Orthopedic Care with Dr Ryno du Plessis at Louis Leopoldt Hospital

Bulumko went to see Dr Ryno du Plessis on 18 January 2018. Bulumko has bowleg syndrome, also known as Blount disease. Bulumko and his mom visited Tygerberg Hospital. He had his first operation on Wednesday 21 November 2018 at Tygerberg Hospital. He received physiotherapy at the new clinic in Zola. The follow up appointment was on 11 December 2018. The plan is to do the next operation in March 2019.

Highlights for the year:

Education Involvement:

Heidi, our CEO/Trustee received a call from a Grade R teacher at Paarl Boy's Primary. She informed Heidi, that a 5-year-old boy in their school was confronted by another boy who wanted to touch his private parts. The boy responded by saying **"NO, this is my body"** the teacher asked the parents how the boy knew how to handle the situation so maturely, and they informed her that he attended the Body Preventive Talk done by Halli Trust in his previous school, Bizweni Primary in Somerset West. Its wonderful for us to hear, that sexual abuse was prevented through one Body Preventive Talk. A whole generation was touched by one informed act.

Community Involvement:

The building of the **United Methodist Church of Southern Africa in Asanda Village** is our biggest project so far. Martin Naude, our Founder, has done a huge thing for the church and for Halli Trust as we will benefit with this building to use it for our Halli Clubs and for training in the community. With the assistance of many sponsors, they were able to finish a 150m² United Methodist Church of Southern Africa, in Asanda Village. The opening was celebrated on Friday 6th April 2018.

Bulumko Mtati 11 years old, went to see Dr Ryno du Plessis on 18 January 2018. Bulumko has bowleg syndrome, also known as Blount disease. Bulumko and his mom visited Tygerberg Hospital. Rozelle (Niesie) Jacobs 7 years from Smartie Town has Fetal Alcohol Syndrome and really struggle in school, although she is eager to learn, we saw it at the Homework classes that is is behind and struggles with basis schoolwork. She went for assessment in 2018 to hopefully get a place at Rusthoff School. She gets teased at her current school. Helen Jonkers, our Needlework Representative, assisting Niesie's mother, Heidi and we are grateful to report that Niesie will start at Rusthoff School in 2020.

Shireel Roode 11 years from Halli Club in Smartie Town, Helen Jonkers, our Needlework Representative, took it upon her to get Shireel enrolled in school. She never attended school so far and Helen started to care for her and try to get the mother involved. Helen enrolled her in Valsbay Primary School in Macassar, and she started Grade 1 in January 2019. We are so proud of Helen for her caring heart and for making such an effort to get Shireel in school. Shireel is loving her school and is doing really well.

Plaatjies Family – We have assisted the Plaatjies family for a while. Anastacia, our Community Representative also assisted them. Gloria Bike our volunteer Social Worker with the help of Massindance assisted her with social and medical issues. We almost gave up on her, that there will not be change and then Josephine said to us: "Thank you so much for helping me, I am getting my disability money monthly and I am doing much better since Halli Trust helped me". We were blown away that something positive did happen as we really though this is not going to end positively. Just show you to never give up and that we as Halli Trust always bring hope!!! Big thank you to everybody that took hands to help this family!!!

The Needlework Club moved from Smartie Town to the Halli Trust office in Somerset West in January'18.

15 Ladies attended the Club on Friday mornings. Leonie Taljaard is mentoring the Club, and we would like to thank her for her creativity with teaching the ladies all sorts of crafts. Because of the move, it made such a huge impact on the ladies attending the Club. 2 Ladies started their own businesses, and one of the ladies won a brand-new sewing machine.
